

## NJ5 First Impressions: D80, P24, P25 ■

Now red, light blue and dark blue stars and diamonds shine out against a natural ground. Again, it's a bright and pretty piece, although the halo of half-tones around the diamond is a bit distracting. Half-stars form the border and there probably were quarter stars in the corners. The motifs are on a relatively small scale.

## Later:

Can I get rid of the halo of half-tones around the diamond by reversing the tie-downs (the 1's and 2's) in the tie-up? I'll try it on the computer:D81, D82 -

Well, yes, the halo disappeared around the diamond, but shifted to the inside of the star! Oh - the tie-up is imperfect - and, as it stands, a halo is inevitable. The draftwriter didn't always pair up the block he wanted to treadle with the proper tiedown thread - or vice versa. (See page 12 for a further explanation.)
